## RESOLUTION NO. 54-127

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Huntsville heretofore on the 12th day of August, 1954, adopted Resolution No. 54-109, which resolution authorized the Mayor of the City of Huntsville to acquire for and on behalf of the City of Huntsville by purchase from the owner or owners thereof the real estate hereinafter described in this resolution together with the well located on the same; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Huntsville has reported to the City Council of the City of Huntsville that he has made a diligent effort to purchase and acquire said property and well for and on behalf of the City of Huntsville, and that he is unable to acquire said property and well for the City of Huntsville by purchase.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Huntsville that it is the opinion and judgment of the City Council of the City of Huntsville that it is necessary for the City of Huntsville to obtain and acquire the real estate hereinafter described in this resolution and the well located on said real estate for the City of Huntsville's use and purpose in obtaining a source of water and water supply sufficient for its inhabitants and users within contiguous areas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Huntsville that the Mayor of the City of Huntsville, be, and he is hereby authorized to cause condemnation proceedings to be instituted in the name of and on behalf of the City of Huntsville in order that the City of Huntsville may acquire from the owner or owners thereof real estate in the County of Madison, State of Alabama, and the well located thereon, said real estate being particularly described as follows, to wit:

A lot forty (40) feet East and West and sixty (60) feet North and South in the Southwest corner of the following described tract: Beginning at a point on the North margin of the Athens Pike, which point is ten (10) chains East and .70 chains North from the Southwest corner of Section thirty three (33), Township three (3), Range one (1) West; thence North  $l_{\frac{1}{4}}$  degrees West 11.50 chains to an iron stake; thence West parallel with the section line 2.03 chains to an iron stake; thence South  $l_{\frac{1}{4}}$  degrees East 11.10 chains to an iron stake on the North margin of Athens Pike; thence along the North margin of said pike South  $78\frac{1}{4}$  degrees East 2.03 chains to the place of beginning, and containing 2.25 acres, more or less,
